


Socio-historical Context

- 1793-1920 Poznan and Wielkopolska region under Prussian rule
- 1919-1920 Wielkopolska Uprising
- 1939-1945 Poznan and Wielkopolska incorporated into the III Reich as Warthegau
 - expulsions of Poles 38,000 from Poznan, 630,000 from Warthegau
 - 1940 German plans to develop the city, liquidation of cemeteries in the city centre
 - 1944 Allied bombings
- 1945 Poznan liberated / captured by the Red Army
- 1950s liquidation of cemeteries by the Polish administration




Jewish cemeteries in Poznań – over time and space







Image schemata

- "... image schema is a condensed redescription of perceptual experience for the purpose of mapping spatial structure onto conceptual structure. (...) [they are] the basis for organizing knowledge and reasoning about the world." [Oakley 2007: 215]
- they originate in bodily movement through space, object manipulation, perception
- CONTAINER, PART- WHOLE, LINK, CENTER-PERIPHERY, FAR-CLOSE, IN-OUT, SOURCE-PATH-GOAL



The inherent axiological ambivalence of the CONTAINER schema

- CONTAINER as <u>shelter</u> value: safety, security, protection (related image schema: LINK)
- CONTAINER as <u>prison</u> value: (lack of) freedom (related image schema: BONDAGE)

Container schema and the power of place and space

 In and out of place refers to territorial control as constitutive of spcial relations and power.
Spatial interaction refers to the role of space in natural science causality and its application to human behaviour. Surface and depth, or appearance and reality, refers to the role of space and place as problematizing meaning.


resemiotization
