The visual aspects of the Old English gloss to the *Eadwine Psalter*

The *Eadwine Psalter* is a mid-twelfth century manuscript made in Christ Church, Canterbury, roughly a hundred years following the Norman Conquest. This historical background is evident in its linguistic layer: it is a tripartite, display manuscript, containing the three Latin versions of the psalter: *Gallicanum* (with an Anglo-Norman gloss), *Romanum* (with an Old English gloss) and *Hebraicum* (with a Latin gloss). The *mise-en-page* has been for a long time interpreted as being reflective of the socio-political circumstances following the Conquest – the Old English gloss is believed to be inferior to the Anglo-Norman one (Webber 1992). Moreover, although the Old English gloss is among the precious few complete Old English psalter glosses that have survived until today, due to its numerous, heavy corrections in the first 77 psalms, it was for a long time deemed useless from the perspective of historical linguistics.

The present paper discusses the results of the analysis of the numerous (almost 2000 in total) corrections found in the first 50 Psalms, in order to gain an insight into various ways in which corrections to the gloss – as one of the manuscript's visual aspects – can provide new insight into the inter-relationships of its languages and offer a new interpretation of its *mise-en-page*. It is proposed that the corrections to the gloss are indeed a valuable source of not only linguistic information, but that they can also shed some light on non-linguistic controversies surrounding the Old English gloss to the *Eadwine Psalter*, such as the cultural dynamics surrounding the Psalter's production.
