We are also going to focus on research methods used in the field in order to address the question of what they reveal about language representation vs. processing and how they can inform the theory. PhD students and early career researchers are especially welcome to present their research interests and ideas.

We invite proposals in all areas of research in multilingual acquisition and processing, whether or not linked directly to the overarching EPICamp theme, including:

- multiple language acquisition and learning (L3, Ln);
- psycho- and neurolinguistics of multilingualism;
- early multilingualism and heritage language development in multilingual settings;
- language processing in multilinguals;
- multilingual language use in different contexts;
- language awareness in multilinguals.

The three categories of proposals include: (1) presentations by one or more authors (20 minutes), (2) posters, (3) topics for discussion.
