

**Scientific presentations of PhD students  
of the Interdisciplinary Doctoral Studies (IDS)**

*Innovative language research in interdisciplinary perspectives:  
Psychology, sociology and technology*

GUIDELINES

The purpose of the scientific presentations is to present the progress the PhD students have made in the preparation of their PhD theses. The presentation is a mandatory part of the IDS curriculum and takes place every year in June. The dates are set by the head of the IDS. A successful presentation is necessary to complete each year of the IDS.

The presentation will take place in the presence of the Committee consisting of:

1. The head of the ISD
2. The coordinator of the project: *Innovative language research in interdisciplinary perspectives: Psychology, sociology and technology*
3. The supervisor

The auxiliary supervisor can be a member of the Committee and take part in the presentation.

The PhD students should present the progress of their PhD projects in the form of a Power Point presentation. The progress achieved in a given academic year should be presented in relation to specific aspects of the PhD thesis, for example, literature review, methodology, data obtained, etc. The presentation should include no more than 10 - 15 slides and last a maximum of 20 minutes. After the presentation, the Committee will ask questions regarding the content of the presentation.

After asking questions and obtaining answers, the Committee will decide whether or not the presentation is satisfactory as a whole, taking into account the answers given to questions from members of the Committee.

The elements to be assessed are:

1. Content: progress in the preparation of the PhD thesis, including the preparation and conduct of research (70%)
2. Answers to questions asked by the Committee (20%)
3. Elements of scientific presentation at the academic level (10%)

The PhD student will be notified orally by the Committee whether or not the presentation was evaluated as satisfactory. Detailed comments indicating both strengths and weaknesses of the presentation will be presented to the PhD student by his/her supervisor.
