Workshop 1

Understanding ourselves as teachers better and understanding our classrooms better

In this workshop Mark will share ideas of where we are now in EFL, give some practical ideas of what a genuinely communicative classroom might look like and leave SPACE for TEACHERS to express their own concerns about their classrooms.

Workshop 2

Observing language change as a means of developing as a teacher and as a tool for broadening our students' horizons and making them more open-minded as people as well as users of English.

400 years ago we had privateers, pirates really who went out into the world and stole from others, now we have brexiteers. Remainers have become remoaners and the Oxford English Dictionary's word of the year in 2017 was youthquake.

As language teachers, keeping abreast of language change is one of many skills in our professional repertoire and one which potentially can be mobilised to teach our students to be more flexible and more comfortable with ambiguity and change.

Mark Andrews has been working in Eastern and Central Europe for over 30 years as a teacher trainer in ELT. For 12 years he worked as an ELT consultant for the British Council in Czechoslovakia, the Czech Republic and Hungary. He coordinated the IATEFL-Hungary Culture and Literature Special Interest Group for 5 years. He co-authored the coursebook "Zoom In". Every summer he runs courses in Devon, Slovakia and Serbia for teachers of English, also from Poland. Mark has done two tours in Poland for Oxford University Press. He currently works as training director at SOL (Sharing One Language).
